New Radio Programs

Broadcasting Ephesians

We started broadcasting the new programs on Ephesians this month. They will continue until around the middle of August. The content is a bit more advanced, so transitioning from The Gospel of John to Ephesians might be a big step for new listeners. I am looking forward to seeing what the feedback will be.

Our Place in the Body of Chirst

In the program I recorded on Ephesians 4:4, The Circle, I gave a description that will help you to

better understand your place in the body of Christ. I described the perimeter of the circle as being the line people cross when going from being lost to saved, and that most people do remain close to the perimeter throughout their Christian lives. I described God being at the center of the circle and we draw closer to Him by believing more of truth and reality as He defines it. When a person becomes a child of God it happens through an acknowledgment of the truth, but there is very little truth known of their God. The discovery of our God begins here, but it certainly will remain a life long pursuit.

The discovery of truth is what gets people to cross the line, but without a continual pursuit of getting to know our God, we will stay close to it, and not move towards the center where He is. This is why the density around the perimeter is very high, and the density decreases closer to the center. What this means is the closer you grow to the Lord, the farther away you will get from those who do not. You will start to feel a sense of isolation from other believers, and the desire for fellowship with others will increase.

The loneliness we feel will encourage us to go and seek out fellowship with those who do not know the Lord like we do. On a percentage basis, it is unrealistic to expect to have more than a handful of others in your geographical proximity who are mature in the faith beyond forgiveness, freedom from the law and living by the inheritance as a child of God. There will not be enough people to form a church and isolate from everyone else on a long term basis. This is a good thing. This is a way the Lord sends mature believers to immature believers so they can grow to know Him more.

To get a better perspective on a percentage basis, consider some reasonable estimates. If you have an average protestant congregation of one hundred people, you might be able to find one or two people who have a strong understanding of the Gospel with regards to the complete forgiveness of sins, the restoration of life, and what it means to live by the inheritance in Christ. The people assembled together are perhaps one in a thousand people in their geographical proximity. These numbers can of course be adjusted for your local area, but with this kind of calculation, you are only going to find one in ten thousand people who you are going to experience peaceful, quality fellowship with when you spend time with one another. In a population of one million people, you would then have around one hundred people who you would have a similar maturity level as yourself. If we change the one in a thousand people in a general area to one in a hundred, there would only be one thousand people in a million person population. Keep in mind though that everyone has their own unique lives and relationships with others that will limit the time they have available to meet with you. When you do these kinds of basic calculations, it can be easy to understand why you likely only have one or two people in your life who you would consider to be mature in the faith.

The present outreach of Living God Ministries through radio has an average listener count of between half a million and three quarters of a million people every day. This is a huge number of people who have their radios tuned in to their local Christian radio station and we show up just like any other ministry program. When you consider these percentages, what do you suppose most of the listeners are thinking when they hear our program? I can tell you from many years of doing this work, they know there is something to what they are hearing but they just can't quite figure it out. They know there is truth in the message they hear, but it doesn't fit with what they already believe, so they keep listening wondering when I am going to tell them to repent and obey. Of course I never do, but

they keep listening. What usually happens is there is some kind of break through moment. They are either going through a major change in their life encouraging them to seriously consider what their relationship with God is about, or they grasp a small piece of what I say that just really gets their attention. It's in these critical moments that I normally break through to the listeners.

I am of course fortunate that not everyone has this kind of life changing enlightenment at the same time. The flow of new people communicating with me directly is in general at a pace I can handle. I respond to emails and letters in between working on new recordings. When someone is really ready to understand what it means to live in the new life we have in Christ, it doesn't usually take me very long to help them work through their specific issues and get them moving in the right direction.
